You need to enroll before you attend 4-H meetings and activities so you are covered as a 4-H member at an event!

As a 4-H family, you need to create a family first on 4-H Online then add members to your family!

You need to sign up as a 4-H volunteer if you will be leading any children other than your own. This also includes chaperones at camps or EVEN taking another 4-H member in your car! (Even if they are close friends)

4-H Members: \$25 (till October 31st)


Cloverbuds- \$10

4-H members are recognized by grade now not age! However, you must be 8 and 3rd grade to be a 4-H member!



When enrolling in 4-H, you can choose as many projects you are interested in. This is for the State 4-H Office to know what projects 4-H members are enrolling in Texas. You can go back and add or delete projects as you wish throughout the year.

The Extension Office sometimes uses these to email you about project meetings.

NOTE: It is ultimately up to you as a 4-H family to check 4-H Blasts to see what 4-H project meetings are available and when they meet.

You **MUST** enroll in 1 community 4-H Club!

Our community 4-H Clubs are:

We also have our **Shooting Sports 4-H Club**! However, you **MUST** enroll in a community 4-H club above to be in shooting sports club! The Community 4-H Club will be your primary 4-H Club

You need to make sure you attend your 4-H meetings to learn about 4-H news and opportunities! It's also a great group to make friends and share 4-H experiences with! Each 4-H Club fundraises for the club and county! Those funds raised pay for 4-H contest fees!

4-H Members need to do eligibility forms 1 week before a contest to be able to get out of school and to make sure you are eligible! 4-H Sanctioned events are the only events you can use eligibility forms for!

Project meetings do not count as 4-H club meetings!
